  possibility of harm and create control measures to eliminate or reduce workplace
  hazards.
- To identify high risk works and implement required safety measures to minimise risks. i.e. asbestos, working at heights, mobile plant equipment and live electrics.
- To monitor the performance of our Occupation Health and Safety Management System and review its effectiveness in achieving Zero Harm.

Each and every person is required to actively follow all safety standards, directions, procedures, instructions and proper use of safety equipment. Along with reporting all hazards, injuries or ill health as soon as they are identified to proactively prevent the occurrence of safety issues.
